GIVING THAT KEEPS GIVING

Every project that we have implemented through a Global Grant is a gift to our communities. Such gifts have created a lasting impact on the lives of those who received them.

Some of these gifts were packaged as microcredit loans, scholarships, youth leadership sponsorships, back -to-school kits, free educational books to school children, medical equipment, school libraries, boreholes, wheelchairs and mobility aids, building local economies, volunteering and so forth.

Like the proverbial 'gift that keeps giving'. These projects continue to make a difference long after they are completed and handed over to the communities. The benefits are tangible, measurable, and sometimes scalable over time.

This November, we celebrate the Rotary Foundation and our dedication as Rotarians to 'create lasting change in the world'. We trust that the Rotary Foundation will keep transforming our gifts and those of our donors and partners into service projects that will improve lives locally and globally.

But we also need to prepare ourselves to access the Foundation's Global Grants that will empower our local Rotary Clubs to undertake more projects that will address the most urgent needs of our communities.

Projects that will eliminate diseases, protect mothers and children, provide clean and accessible water, safeguard our environments and boost local economies.

Global grants are a way for Rotary International to support large-scale international activities that have sustainable and measurable outcomes in Rotary's areas of focus.

To apply for a global grant, clubs and districts need to be qualified each year by following certain rules.

These include: signing the club qualification memorandum of understanding by the president and president-elect; completing the grant management seminar training by at least one club member, either online or in person, or both; and meeting any additional requirements set by the district.

Global grants can fund these types of activities: humanitarian projects that address community needs; scholarships for graduate-level academic studies in another country; and vocational training teams that exchange professional skills and knowledge with another country.

The minimum budget for a global grant is \$30,000 and the maximum World Fund award is \$400,000. Grant sponsors can use a combination of district designated funds (DDF), cash, and/or directed gifts and endowment earnings to fund a global grant.

The Foundation will match 80 percent of DDF contributions with the World Fund. There is no minimum World Fund match.

Starting a grant process requires planning and preparedness. Clubs should encourage their members and officers to learn more about the subject matter through the Rotary Learning Center.

There are also various tools, resources, reference materials and experts available for more information and guidance. It is better to be well prepared than to make a mistake. The Rotary Club of Lagos has received global grants for implementing projects that created positive impacts in local communities. With the help of our experts and partners, we can do it again soon.

'Together we will continue to make a difference'.





CURRENT POSITION

Donations by members increased to \$22,287.38 as at the October 23, 2023 (September: \$20,387.00) from 11 donors (September: 6), including 4 PHFs.

ACTIVITIES.

- 1. Rotarians were sensitized on importance of paying up for Polio Plus and EREY. This yielded dividend as 6 RCL members paid for Polio Plus and 3 paid for EREY. We eagerly expect more donations in this regard.
- 2. A Rotarian donated \$1,000.00 to the Endowment Fund during the month
- 3. We are still following up with the District office for the replacement of an incorrectly written PHF certificate.
- 4. 2 members were engaged for PHF membership and 1 for Bequest Society membership.

We continue to see delayed donations due to the rising exchange rate and adverse economic conditions. However, we are optimistic that donations will pick up.

- c. Word Peace and Understanding Day Committee Reporting the committee's plan, the chair of the committee Rotarian Toki Mabogunje announced the tentative date as February 14th, 2024.

A draft budget and program are still being explored subject to board's approval. The committee is looking to raise funds, secure full attendance and have sought the approval to go ahead. Three themes have been put forward, together with some selected speakers to be picked from.

d. President's Dinner Organizing Committee.

The chairman of the committee Rotarian Victor Ikeji, presented the summary of the budget for the president's dinner.

It was pulled out of R.I and set up with its two board members. Rotary foundation basically supports and funds humanity in the 7 core focus areas. When one supports Rotary foundation, the Rotary foundation issues a certificate and decorates such persons with a pin which stays with them for life.

He highlighted the different levels of support and the names attached to each level. He cited an example of

the polio and the recent polio walk, where awareness is created yearly to kick polo out and remain at Zero.

How do we celebrate Rotary Foundations?

There are 3 levels to celebrating Rotary Foundation:

- 1) Organize programs to sensitize the community and encourage Rotarians to participate in the program.
- 2) Raise funds by encouraging members to support, through working with the district and R.I to attract district grant for our various projects and
- 3) Work with RI to attract funding for our various projects.

Concluding, he applauded the club, having demonstrated a sound understanding of the role the club can play. Last year, RCL became the highest donor in the district to R.I by raising about \$200,000. For this Rotary year, the citation goal is **\$210,000**. However, due to the current economic condition in the country, things have slowed down a bit.

However, Rotarians are givers and Rotarians will always give in times of adversity and in times of abundance, Rotarians will continue to give. As we speak, the club has raised \$35,000 and will continue on that match, to hit \$200,000, he stated.

By the efforts of this club, District 9110 emerged the highest contributor to Rotary Foundation in the entire African continent last rotary year. The award was presented to the district at the rotary institute Lusaka, Zambia. He appealed to those who are yet to pay up for polio plus to please pay up. The club is planning to be an all Paul Harris Fellow Club, with the 128 members. Over 60 members are already PHF, 6 major donors, 2 Arch-Klum Society.







United States

After a 2021 tornado and subsequent electrical fire damaged the African American Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky, a Rotary club in the city acquired a \$10,000 disaster relief grant from District 6710 to help restore the museum. But "we didn't just want to be handing out the check," says Vickie Elrod, a past president of the Rotary Club of Bowling Green. "We wanted to get boots on the ground to get involved with the preservation of those artifacts." About a dozen Rotarians attended workshops on archiving, and the club is assisting the museum in digitizing documents.

They include records on Shake Rag, a once-vibrant district settled by former slaves and soldiers who fought for the Union in the Civil War. The financial assistance enabled the museum to work with a conservator on preserving its uniforms and other clothes. The museum reopened in August, and Rotarians continue to assist with cleaning damaged artifacts, pictures, and equipment.

Jamaica

Advocates in Jamaica highlight a shortage of housing that meets the needs of people with limited mobility. The Rotary Club of Kingston funded a nearly \$23,000 refurbishment of Cheshire Village, a transitional housing facility associated with a rehabilitation center.

"Rotarians were instrumental and involved in the three town halls we had with residents," says Karsten Johnson, the club's immediate past president. "Our plans were made based on their priorities." The Kingston club, supported by donations from the Rotary Club of Naples North, Florida, raised the height of toilets and added support bars and railings along restroom walls.

The club installed new kitchen cupboards, sinks, and faucets to improve accessibility for people who use wheelchairs. A first phase, to install six solar streetlights, was completed in February, with the retrofit finished in June.

Portugal

The Rotary Club of Almancil International takes an active approach in its mission to serve children, notably those with autism spectrum disorders or Down syndrome. Members sponsor activities including surfing lessons and animal therapy.

In June the club unveiled a sensory room at a school to serve students ages 5 to 16. "The room is now complete, with state-of-the-art equipment including a soothing waterbed, music, and many sensory light and tactile objects," says club member Peter Hinze, who coordinated the project. "[It] can provide a sense of calm and help improve [students'] visual and auditory skills and help regulate their behavior." The project cost more than \$16,000.

The club provided about \$5,000, with businesses and friends donating the remainder.

Belgium

The Rotary Club of Virton en Gaume organized two days of concerts to celebrate the 10th anniversary of the Coralpins Gaumais, a trio that plays the traditional alphorn, a wooden horn once used by shepherds in the Alps. More than 140 alphornists, flag throwers, and bell ringers in folk costume participated in the event in May.

The event raised money for the club's charitable causes. The alphorn was the ideal instrument for harmoniously bringing together nature and the people who live in the region, says Jean-Marie Henin, a past club president. The club was inspired to put on the concert series after it organized visits by the Coralpins Gaumais to nursing homes and other care facilities during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Sri Lanka

While sea turtles can live to be more than 100 years old, as few as 1 in 10,000 survive to adulthood, according to some experts. Five of the world's seven sea turtle species visit Sri Lanka, but poaching for food and shells, along with disruption caused by recreation, imperils the creatures.

The Rotaract Club of CINEC at the Colombo International Nautical and Engineering College in Malabe organized a public webinar to raise awareness of the vulnerability of turtles, coral, and other sea life.

Then in April the club offered the marine reptiles a leg up with an overnight operation to move turtle eggs out of harm's way. More than two dozen Rotaractors met at Rekawa Beach near Tangalle to help transport about 350 eggs to a conservation center for safe hatching.

They worked by the light of cellophane-covered lamps to avoid disturbing the light-sensitive turtles. "We were shown by experts how to carefully dig around the nest to expose and collect the eggs," project chair Monalee Dissanayake says.





- WOMEN IN ROTARY

Until 1989, the Constitution and Bylaws of Rotary International stated that Rotary club membership was for males only. In 1978 the Rotary Club of Duarte, California, invited three women to become members. The RI board withdrew the charter of that club for violation of the RI Constitution. The club brought suit against RI claiming a violation of a state civil rights law which prevents discrimination of any form in business establishments or public accommodations.

The appeals court and the California Supreme Court supported the Duarte position that Rotary could not remove the club's charter merely for inducting women into the club. The United States Supreme Court upheld the California court indicating that Rotary clubs do have a "business purpose" and are in some ways public-type organizations. This action in 1987 allowed women to become Rotarians in any jurisdiction having similar "public accommodation" statutes.

The RI constitutional change was made at the 1989 Council on Legislation, with a vote to eliminate the "male only" provision for all of Rotary.
