

ROTARY CLUB OF LAGOS DISTRICT (9110) THE ROTARY FOUNDATION (TRF) REPORT FOR MARCH 2024.

Month – on - month, there was a very significant growth in donations to TRF, raising the possibility of RCL exceeding the 2024 Rotary year Citation goal.

This is a sharp contrast from the concerns raised during the Board meeting of February 2024 although we maintained optimism in the February report.

Evidently, follow-ups and the concerns around further devaluation of the domestic currency triggered action by members.

It is hoped that the improvement in the exchange rate will elicit further donations in the final months of 2024 Rotary year. Below is a recap of the Citation goal aggregating to \$114,000.00

- 4. We are still encouraging members to subscribe to Bequest Society membership as there are no immediate financial implications.


CONCLUSION

INTRODUCTION

After careful consideration, Hope and Ireti Primary Schools both located at 4, Mekunwen Road, Ikoyi, Lagos State were visited and identified as beneficiary of intervention projects.

An overview of the health, safety and environment onsite assessment of the schools was carried out highlighting possible areas of intervention.

The committee finally decided on improving the learning condition of the pupils by procuring and installation of new fans, alongside the repairs of old faulty fans. This saw an improvement to learning conditions and better environmentally friendly classrooms for the pupils.

HIGHLIGHTS

Following several health and safety assessment done, the district environment committee carried out the following classroom improvement in both schools listed below:

1. PROCUREMENT AND INSTALLATION OF BRAND-NEW FANS:

The committee procured brand new fans and contracted an electrical engineer to couple and install them in the classes. The new fans also were branded for reference purposes.

2. REPAIR OF EXISTING FANS: Many of the classrooms' fans were damaged due to water leakage from the ceiling, high power surge and lack of regular maintenance checks. The committee has contracted an electrician who will repair the fans (replacing worn-out electrical parts, and reinstalling new ones) targeted at creating a safer, learning environment.

PROJECT EXECUTION

The project execution commenced on Friday15th March 2024 with the procurement of brandnew fans for the classrooms. The committee supervised the installation of the new fans completed on Saturday 23rd of March 2024 and confirmed efficiency.

The repairs (servicing and changing of worn-out parts) of existing fans are in place and will be completed by Saturday







Furthermore, the club hosted a successful Training Retreat for members, providing valuable learning opportunities and fostering a culture of continuous growth and development.


